Susan McLean is Australia's foremost expert in the area of Cybersafety and young people.

Susan brings a wealth of knowledge and practical down to earth elements to her presentations. She is a mother of three children and was the first Victorian Police Officer appointed to a position involving Cybersafety and young people. She took her first report of cyberbullying in 1994 and since then she has conducted extensive research and has

completed advanced training in this area in both the USA and UK and is a sought after presenter and advisor to Schools, elite sporting bodies such as the AFL, GP's, and both State and Federal Governments.

She has authored resources for the Victorian DET, writes and reviews school policy, provides crisis management/advice to schools and is afforded 'expert' status on the Safer Internet Programme Data Base.

Susan is also a member of the Australian Government's Cybersafety working group and a published author. Her book 'Sext's Texts and Selfies', is the definitive parents' guide to helping their children stay safe online.

Susan suggests to be confident in setting rules and boundaries around internet use in the home. It's OK to say NO! The session will conclude with time for questions.

'Cyber Safety Solutions' is an informative and entertaining session for you and is delivered with Susan's famous 'no nonsense' approach and she will cover the *positive* benefits of technology as well as what you need to *be aware of*:-

- **What are kids doing online** - The popular social networking sites and apps such as KiK, Musical.ly and Instagram. What they are, what are the legal ages to use them and why these rules should be obeyed? The difference between an 'online friend' and a 'stranger'.
- **Online Grooming** - What is it and when/how does it occur? What are the warning signs and what to do if you suspect this is happening to your child.
- **Cyberbullying** - What it is, where it happens, what it looks like, how to prevent and what to do if it occurs. Also the legal consequences and the possible criminal charges.
- **'Sexting'** - the taking and sending of explicit images - what are the REAL consequences (primary school children too).
- **Potential dangers and safety tips** - how to assist the children in your care to stay safe online via parental controls and restriction passcodes.

Susan also covers problematic internet use and gaming issues plus information on the Office of the eSafety Commissioner.
