



Facilities and Improvements

Throughout 2023, we executed a series of modest projects to elevate our facilities and furnishings, enhancing the overall comfort and learning environment for our students.

Initiated by students, the relocation of the Orchid Shade House, within our College premises, has significantly transformed aesthetics and sunlight exposure. This move highlights the Orchid Club's dedication to plant health, benefiting orchids and showcasing careful consideration for their needs.

This club offers valuable hands-on learning experiences in horticulture and aligns with the College's commitment to diverse learning opportunities, strengthening community bonds and enriching the students' overall educational experience. The Orchid Club's success at the Royal Adelaide Agricultural Show exemplifies positive outcomes from student initiatives and community collaboration.

Within the Kildare building, three classrooms underwent a comprehensive transformation involving soundproofing, cladding, painting, and general refurbishment.

The foyer area was refurnished to incorporate comfortable seating, allowing students to spread out and engage in individual learning activities.

Furthermore, an external facelift through the painting of walkways and verandas has illuminated our outdoor facilities.

Additionally, the acquisition of woodworking machinery has expanded opportunities for more year levels to partake in this subject, providing students with a broader range of experiential learning possibilities.





STEM

Our STEM program continues to thrive, with the inclusion of the F1 in Schools and Subs in Schools programs, through Years 8 and 9. These initiatives provide students with immersive experiences in engineering, design, and problemsolving, preparing them for future careers in STEM fields. In 2023, our STEM Making A Difference (MAD) Year 8 students demonstrated remarkable achievements, with their Specialised Air Purifying Ecosystem project, resulting in awards in the Secondary Category (Years 7-12), not only showcasing their creativity and teamwork but also highlighting Kildare College's commitment to nurturing exceptional STEM education.

Cafe Culture and Photography

Fostering a dynamic and engaging learning environment, Kildare College remains committed to continuously enhancing our curriculum to meet the evolving needs and interests of our students. In response to valuable feedback and surveys conducted with our student body and community, we have implemented exciting new additions to our curriculum, including Cafe Culture and Photography courses through Years 9 and 10. These hands-on, experiential learning opportunities have allowed students to explore their creative passions while developing practical skills applicable to various industries.

Special Entry Dance Program

Kildare College's Special Entry Dance Program took a momentous stride forward in 2023 by extending the offering into Year 8 for the first time. This program has been meticulously designed to nurture students with high potential in dance, providing them with a unique educational experience that encompasses performance, creativity, and in-depth studies in dance technique and theory. Through this comprehensive program, students receive specialised dance training that incorporates essential elements such as fitness disciplines, including Pilates and yoga, nutrition education, and an in-depth exploration of anatomy directly related to dance performance.

Students study and master a diverse range of dance styles, including contemporary, jazz, lyrical, classical ballet, music theatre, tap, hip hop, and cultural dance forms. Furthermore, the program exposes students to alternative dance genres through collaborations with visiting artists, broadening their horizons and fostering artistic exploration. Our Special Entry Dance Program students play an integral part in our mid-year arts performance, allowing students to showcase their talents and hone their stage presence.

NCCD and Education Standards Board Audit

Throughout 2023 Kildare College underwent two important audits - the Education Standards Board (ESB) School Self-Review Audit and the National Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) audit. Passing these audits is crucial as they evaluate the school's adherence to educational standards, data collection processes for student support, and commitment to providing high-quality education for all students.

The ESB audit assesses compliance with educational standards and identifies areas for improvement, while the NCCD audit reviews data collection practices for students requiring adjustments and support. Gathering and analysing the extensive data required for these audits allows Kildare to refine its data collection methods, implement new procedures, and demonstrate its dedication to meeting the diverse needs of its students.

Successfully passing these audits not only ensures Kildare meets regulatory requirements but also validates the College's efforts in delivering exceptional educational experiences and supporting the individual needs of every student.


NAPLAN


We are pleased to note that participation rates in NAPLAN have increased over the past year, with an impressive 96% of Year 9 students and 99% of Year 7 students participating in all NAPLAN components. This high level of engagement reflects our community's commitment to academic excellence.

Once results are available we analyse all data, identifying areas of strength and areas that require further attention. By doing so, we can tailor our instructional strategies, allocate resources effectively, and implement targeted interventions to support the diverse needs of our students.

Process for Non-Attendance

Students' daily attendance/absence is manually entered into SEQTA by the Teacher, Student Reception or Front Reception for each lesson throughout the day.

Parents of students who sign in late without a note, or prior notification, will receive an SMS by 9.30am. If the College is not notified of a student's absence, an SMS message is sent at 10.00am followed by a phone call and email if notification is still not received.

SMS messages and phone calls to the College are all means of absentee communication between the families and the College. Prolonged continual absence is followed up with communication from the Pastoral Care teacher, or the appropriate House Leader or Middle/Senior Years Coordinators. Long term absences are monitored and followed up by the Counselling Team and/or Leadership Team.

Program for International Student Assessment (PISA) Results 2023


At Kildare, our strong focus on student wellbeing covers all aspects of College life, including a supportive, welcoming and nurturing environment for all students. The PISA Results from 2023 show that there is an outstanding sense of belonging at Kildare College.

The Program is completed across the world, by 690,000 Year 10 students throughout 81 countries. Our results show that 90% of Kildare's students feel a great sense of belonging, compared to the average of 55% across the rest of the world.

Satisfaction Surveys

Each year at Kildare College we survey our community to seek feedback on the level of satisfaction of various elements relating to the College, to ascertain what we are doing well and which areas need improvements.

We encouraged members of the College community to provide feedback. The survey took a short time to complete, and was sent out via a link.

Each question was multiple choice, with answers ranging from 'strongly agree' to 'strongly disagree'. Two free-text comment fields were on the last page of the survey. Recipients were encouraged to respond with extra feedback as appropriate.

The information we gain in these surveys is used to make informed decisions about changes to the College, that benefit students, staff and the community and affirms what the College is doing well.

Recent improvements to the College that have been identified through these satisfaction surveys, include changes to the menu in the canteen to include some healthier options, improved communications with families through SEQTA and the curriculum offerings.
